We are bombarded daily with images and stories of disaster and tragedy of every possible origin. The work on exhibit includes videos by **Kasumi**, photographs by **Michael McCarthy**, paintings by **Jonathan Shimony** and prints by **Rob Stupay**. Collectively, their work stands as a set of questions, not only about the troubling state of affairs but also about the very notion of knowledge and understanding. The work offers no solutions and even raises doubts about our comprehension of events. Their stories are left disturbingly incomplete. Things seem wrong, perhaps terribly wrong, but we are uncertain of what exactly we are being shown, much less how to redress the apparent problems surrounding us in today's world.

With careful mastery of their respective media, each artist addresses the emotions, visions and enigmas of the human experience in modern society. The four artists' works share a sense of unease and uncertainty which is amplified through an often ambiguous scale. The "eyewitness" perspective in their works leaves the viewer unsure of his/her relation to the scene/event depicted. Ultimately, one remains perplexed whether these are visions of past or recent scenes of tragedy or horror or if they are a view of a future world extrapolated from the ever-shifting ground of the present.

Kasumi, a 2011 **Guggenheim Fellow**, is a genuine polymath recognized worldwide for her accomplishments as a filmmaker, visual artist, musician, writer and performer. She creates immersive media art experiences that explore the formation of memory and our collective consciousness. Through the synthesis of film, video, sound, animation, live performance, she has developed a unique language that resembles the stream of subconscious connections making up human perception.

Michael McCarthy received an MFA in photography from the **Tyler School of Art**. Michael has been teaching in university art programs for nearly twenty years in the U.S, Italy, Greece and France. He has received numerous awards and has appeared in galleries and museums in the U.S. and Europe. Michael's exhibition *Human Form* was selected Best Gallery Exhibition of 2012 by Marc Lenot on his *Le Monde* affiliated blog *Lunettes Rouges*.

Jonathan Shimony graduated from Harvard College's Visual and Environmental Studies Department with highest honors. A Luce Foundation Scholarship placed him in the Tokyo School of Art where he was awarded a diploma of higher studies. Returning to Boston he completed a Master of Fine Arts degree at the Massachusetts College of Art and several years later won a Fulbright Scholarship to France, where he has lived ever since. Shimony has had extensive exhibitions and commissions of his prints, paintings and sculptures in Europe, the U.S. and in Asia. His work is currently being exhibited at the Palazzo Bembo as part of the Venice Biennale.

Rob Stupay received a Master of Architecture from **M.I.T.** after receiving a Bachelor of Arts in art from **Brown University**. Studying Architecture led him to computer programming which led him back to painting both with brush on canvas and with pixels on screen. He has exhibited in Boston, London, Australia, and New York. He lives in Paris.


